Dear Customer,

Yesterday, PNM re-filed a rate increase request with the NM Public Regulation Commission.

The average increase for residential customers is 15.8 percent. However, beginning January 2016, before our proposed rate change takes effect, reductions in fuel costs could help lower your bill as much as 7 percent.

Electricity rates differ by region. Here's how bills will change for the average residential customer when new rates take effect:
